I am submitting for your information the quarterly statistics of our activity.

The number of jurors used and trials held diminished in June due to the explosion and closing of the courts the week of June 16th and the relocating of the civil trial judges during the following jury week of June 23rd. We will have criminal trials in the Law and Justice Center in July. I would anticipate a great number of trials in all areas to be held during the three weeks of jury scheduled in August.

The Jury Commission Office did not suffer any ill effects from the explosion and we were able to send out summons for all July juries on schedule. I did have to personally call all the jurors scheduled for the week of June 23rd as the website and the automated phone-in system were out of order on Sunday and Monday.



CASA Program Updates:

The 18th CASA class graduated on May 1st. We had many cases waiting from the Judiciary, so we were able to assign cases very quickly. We began working with the new volunteers to get them accustomed to their case. This is a very time intensive endeavor. We assigned 7 of the volunteers to work with 14 abused and neglected children in McLean County.

The CASA office presented to a group of 31 foster care workers, adoption workers and supervisors, on May 14th. The Baby Fold has had staff turnover in the foster care program, so our office felt it was beneficial to speak to the new workers regarding the CASA program. Collaboration is a very key piece to our program. The CASA volunteers and the foster care caseworkers often work closely together.

The CASA office held an In-Service on May 14th with Noel Knowels from Community Action. Ms. Knowels discussed all of the programs that Community Action provides to the community. The In-service was well attended.

RE: 9-1-1 Calls for May 2003

The attached chart of the 9-1-1 calls for May continue to show an increase in number. This is due to cellular calls that are now placed on the 9-1-1 trunks. In addition, cellular calls for service are continuing to go up as more cell phones are purchased. Two phenomenons are responsible for this increase, the first being what we call "butt" calls or the accidental activation of a pre-programmed 9-1-1 button on the telephone. This usually occurs when someone has the phone in their back pocket and sits on it causing the activation and giving rise to the name, however, activation does occur when the phone is carried in a purse, attaché case, or back pack and is bumped up against another item in the bag.

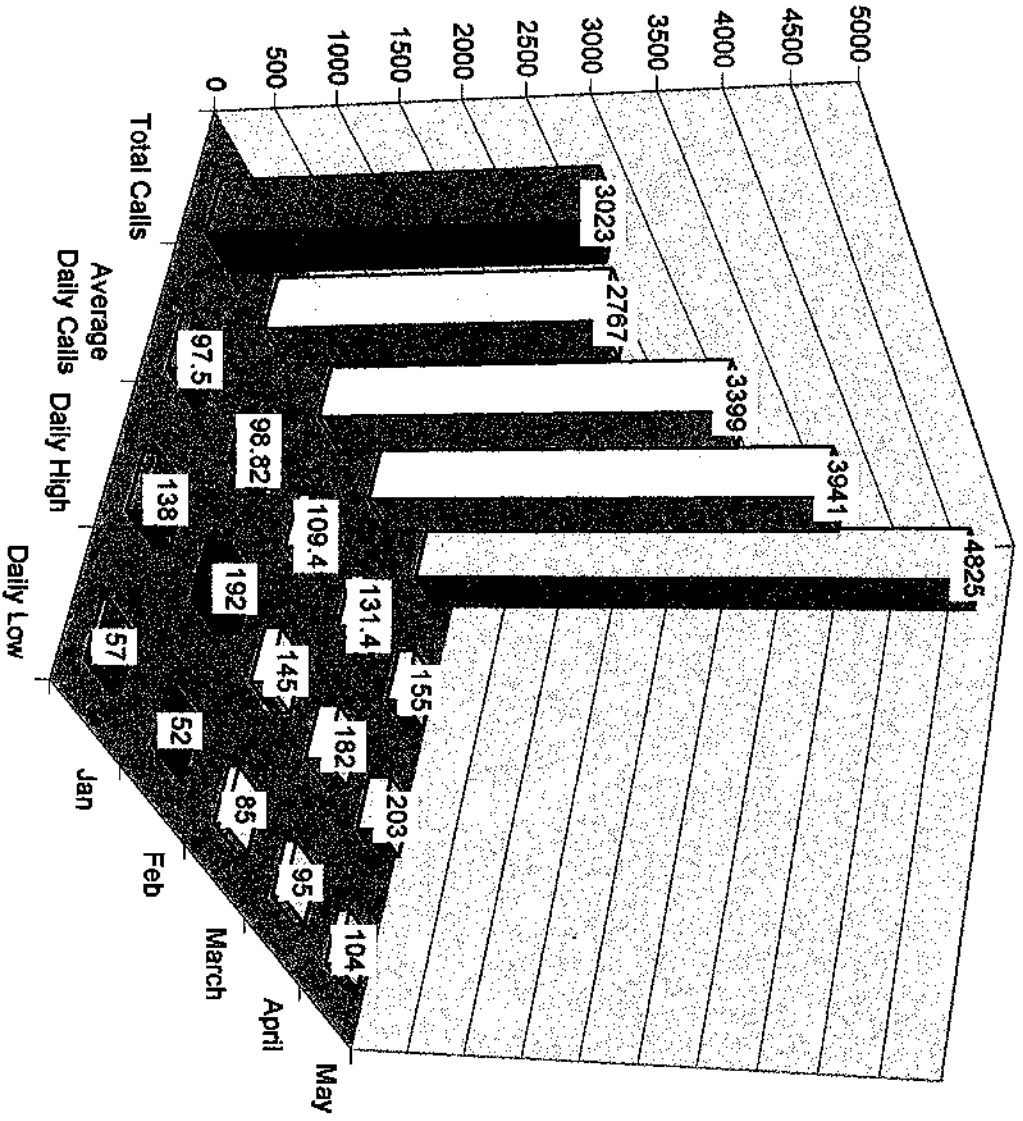
Manufactures are no longer making phone that have a programmed 9-1-1 button but many legacy phones are still on the market that contain the feature so it will take several years to reduce these errors.

The second is called the "roadway good Samaritan ", as cellular phones move from the installed and/or the bag phone types to the small portable units now in use more people have them in the car and can use them to call in accidents or unusual situations. Because of this the center will receive anywhere from three to 25 telephone calls on the same incident depending on what it is. While with Jefferson County, I remember we received 30 cell calls reporting two people either beating a man to death or giving him CPR. As it was on an interstate we responded an EMS unit and a first alarm fire response. When the four units got on scene they found two people field dressing a deer that had been struck by a car. While the intentions are good this phenomena will cause an increase in call volume.

Re: Drug and Alcohol Testing Fees

The McLean County Board has statutory authority to establish fees for offenders sentenced to probation or conditional discharge after conviction of certain offenses to defray the cost of court-ordered drug and alcohol testing. I have attached a copy of Administrative Order 2003-13 which outlines the established fees set by the court.

I am respectfully requesting the McLean County Board adopt an Ordinance which will allow the Circuit Clerk to collect the fees and disperse them into the adult probation service fee account - 0146-0022-0025.

I will be present at the justice meeting to answer any questions you may have.

An ORDINANCE of the McLean County Board
Establishing and Enacting Drug and Alcohol Testing Fees for Offenders
Sentenced to Probation or Conditional Discharge

WHEREAS, pursuant to *730 Illinois Compiled Statutes 5/5-6-3 (g)*, the McLean County Board has authority to enact an Ordinance for the purpose of establishing reasonable fees to defray the costs of court-ordered drug and alcohol testing; and,

WHEREAS, pending the approval of an Ordinance of the McLean County Board Establishing Drug and Alcohol Testing Fees, the Chief Judge of the Eleventh Circuit Court has prepared Administrative Order 2003-13 ordering that offenders sentenced to probation or conditional discharge after conviction of certain offenses pay a drug and alcohol testing fee; and,

WHEREAS, the Justice Committee, at its regular meeting on Monday, July 7, 2003, recommended approval of an Ordinance Establishing and Enacting Drug and Alcohol Testing Fees for offenders sentenced to probation or conditional discharge; now, therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED by the McLean County Board, now meeting in regular session, as follows:

- (1) Pursuant to *730 Illinois Compiled Statutes 5/5-6-3 (g)*, the McLean County Board hereby establishes the following Drug and Alcohol Testing Fees for offenders sentenced to probation or conditional discharge after conviction of certain offenses:

Drug and Alcohol Testing Fee: \$ 7.00 per drug/ \$ 28.00 maximum fee

- (2) The McLean County Board hereby establishes that the fees established by this Ordinance shall be paid to the office of the McLean County Circuit Clerk.
- (3) The McLean County Board hereby establishes that the fees established by this Ordinance shall be ordered and collected as of the effective date of the Chief Judge's Administrative Order 2003-13.
- (4) The McLean County Board hereby directs the County Clerk to forward a certified copy of this Ordinance to the Chief Judge of the Eleventh Circuit Court, the McLean County Circuit Clerk, and the Director of the Court Services Office.

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER 2003-13

Establishment of Drug and Alcohol Testing Fees in McLean County

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, pursuant to an Ordinance adopted by the McLean County Board on _____, 2003, pursuant to the statutory authority allowing County Boards to establish fees for offenders sentenced to probation or conditional discharge after conviction of certain offenses, to establish reasonable fees to defray the costs of court-ordered drug and alcohol testing per 730 ILCS 5/5-6-3(g), the following fees are hereby established to be paid by offenders in McLean County sentenced to probation or conditional discharge:

Drug Testing: \$7.00 per drug/\$28.00 maximum

The defendant shall pay to the testing agency the costs for any follow-up drug testing.

It is further ordered that the fees be assessed in accordance with the defendant's ability to pay, the fees shall be paid to the office of the McLean County Circuit Clerk, together with any other fines or fees to be paid to that office, and the defendant shall pay the costs of each test performed within 30 days of the test.

This administrative order shall be effective upon the date of its entry.

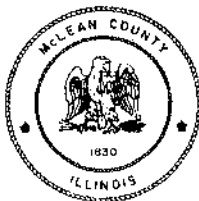

Re: Mobile Shelving Purchase

The Circuit Clerk is requesting approval of the acquisition of Montel Mobile Shelving Units from Retrieval Business Systems. This shelving will be used in the Traffic Division. Funds are available in the Document Storage budget to cover the purchase.

The Circuit Clerk requested a product that would allow use of the existing shelving units on a mobile carriage. The existing shelving is in good shape and does not need replacing. Utilizing the existing shelving produces a significant cost savings.

Consistent with County Purchasing Policy, we attempted to secure formal quotes from at least 3 companies. Because we have a mixture of shelving brands, both Aurora File Co. and Burroughs Shelving declined to quote.

Retrieval Business Systems has proposed the Montel Shelving System. Montel Shelving utilizes a different design that allows our existing shelving to be used, regardless of brand. Many area Circuit Clerks have purchased this product and all of them gave favorable reviews. We went to Logan County to inspect the product in the Circuit Clerks office. She has units in her basement storage area, her vaults, as well as on her work floor. The ease of operation and space savings is impressive. None of the Clerks contacted had experienced any difficulty in the use of existing shelving. All said they would buy more units from Montel/Retrieval in the future to meet their space needs.

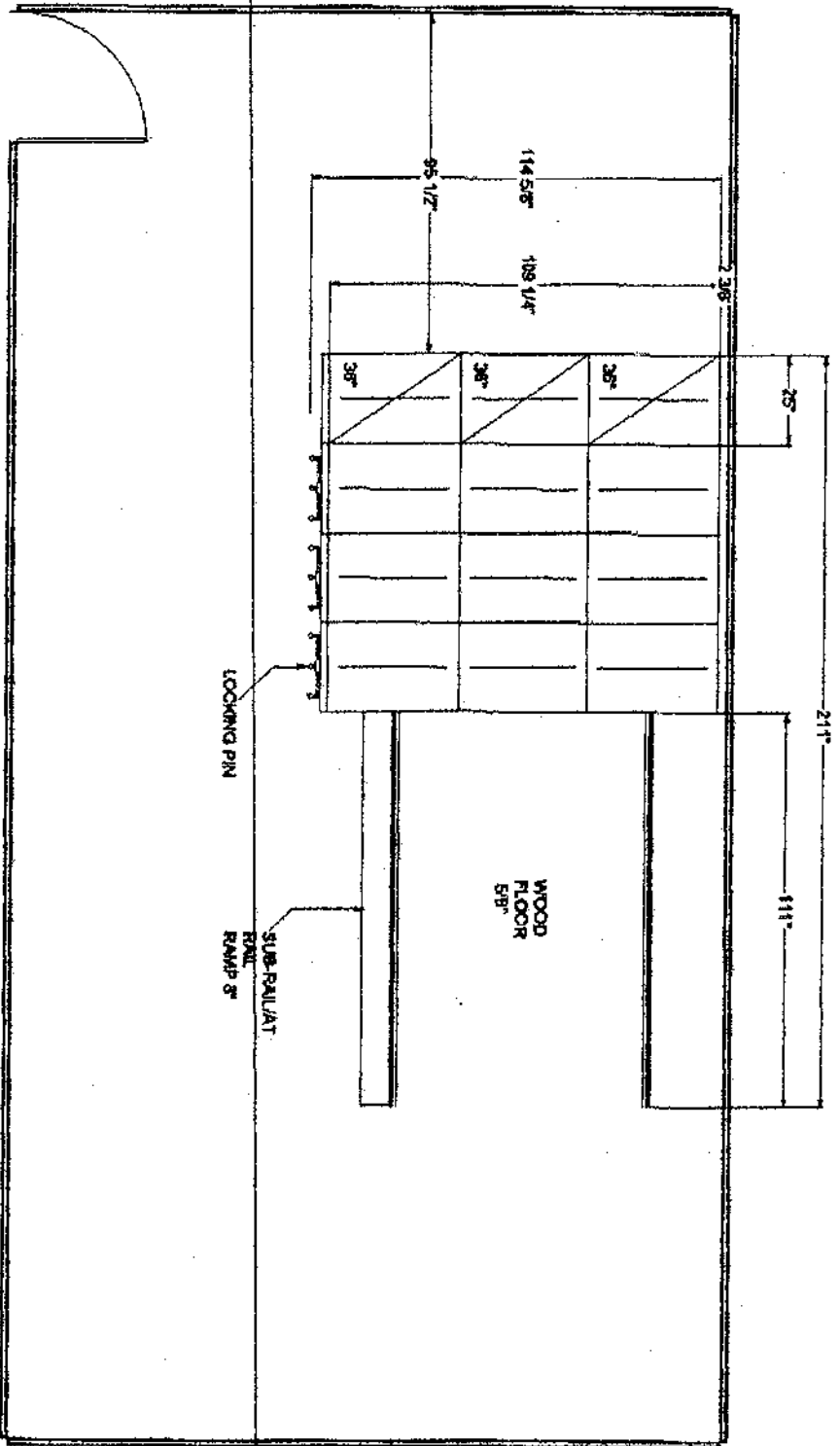
