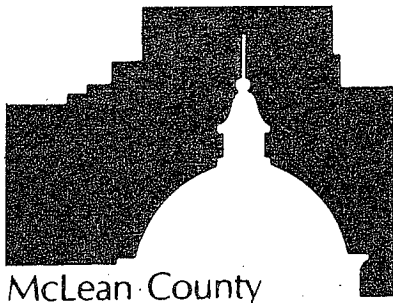

Subj: **Capital Improvements – Law and Justice Center**

In June 2007, the County Board, in keeping with the Board's Budget Policy Resolution, appropriated \$1,750,000.00 for capital improvement projects specifically relating to needed repairs at the McLean County Museum of History located at the old McLean County Courthouse. This project was completed on October 31, 2008 at a total cost of \$1,193,132.00, which includes the professional structural architect fees from Wiss, Janney, Elstner Associates, Inc.

This is to inform you that we have requested the County Auditor to encumber portions of the remaining balance in capital project funds in the following amounts for the below listed projects:

1. Improvements to the Law and Justice Center Third Floor Overhang Heating System:

We have been aware of heating problems with the third floor since 1976. The original heating system design did not adequately provide heat to the third floor on the west, north, and east sides of the building. Consequently, during some winters the perimeter offices are so cold we are unable to maintain acceptable temperatures even with adjunct space heaters. Due to cost factors, we were unable to include the dollars to fix this situation in the Law and Justice Center remodel project funded by the Public Building Commission. We propose an estimated budget of \$200,000.00 which should be sufficient to bid this project in December 2008 to be completed in the Spring of 2009.

2. Wiring Upgrades to the Third, Fourth, and Fifth Floors of the Law and Justice Center:

Our current wiring for technology equipment is located in unsecured janitorial closets next to mop sinks and floor cleaning buckets on these floors. The planned upgrade

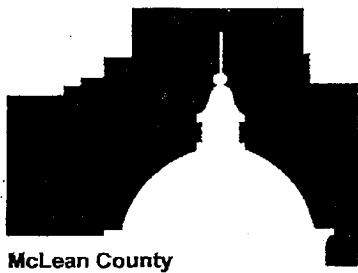
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would relocate these connections to the dedicated and centrally located secure wiring closets on each floor, linked to optical fiber that has been installed as part of the recent renovations project. This would utilize newly installed fiber optic rather than the existing copper wiring. By this method, it will reduce the number of data switches and power supply boxes that are currently required. This will increase the reliability and reduce maintenance costs. This method will also increase capacity and speed to accommodate future technology needs, such as video arraignments. We estimate the cost of this project to be \$160,000.00. We would be able to begin this project shortly after bids are received and expect it to be completed within a two month period.

The total of both projects is \$360,000.00. The remaining dollars in the capital fund are \$556,868.00, which would leave a balance of \$196,868.00.

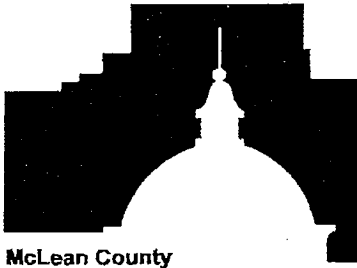

Information & Update

The City of Bloomington Water Department has been exploring the idea of having a third water source, which would be to drill a well, to supplement its current water supply reservoirs, Evergreen Lake and Lake Bloomington. Well water would then be mixed at the Water Department building (at Lake Bloomington) with reservoir water to cut down on nitrate levels. In the middle of September 2008 test borings were commenced at COMLARA Park in the back section of the campground. Since that time the Parks Department attended an informational meeting on October 6, 2008 at Davis Lodge at Lake Bloomington. After attending the meeting the Parks Department had some questions concerning some liability issues. The Parks Department contacted the States Attorney's office with these concerns. These were the questions and answers:

1. Can the City drill without the County's permission? *Yes. Under Section 20 of the Lease Agreement, between the City and the County, it states the City has the right to enter the park "at any time for any purpose related to its use of the waters of Evergreen Lake as a public water supply, or to the preservation, maintenance, augmentation, or replacement of its water facilities". Therefore, permission has already been given to the City by virtue of the language of the agreement.*
2. Is there any way the County would be liable to the local residents if their wells are affected in any way or if they go dry? *No. If the work performed by the City, or its contractors, affects neighboring wells, the City would be potentially liable, not the County.*
3. Is the County liable if anything happens to the persons or property of the well drilling company if any accidents occur while they are out here at the park? *No. The City is liable for its own negligent acts, or its contractors, even if they are performed on the County's leasehold.*

The City has since started a second test boring site located near the Mackinaw Pumping Pool located on the north end of the park. This was started on Tuesday, October 27, 2008. The same day the Parks Department talked with Rick Twait from the City of Bloomington Water Department. He stated that the City is now considering a third test site near the east side (Deer Island Nature Area) of COMLARA Park. The Parks Department will provide updates.

Additional Park Activities

1. Parks Department is working with the Illinois State University Buildings Construction class for planning & design phase and cost estimates for new park visitor center building. This will be part of a major class project for the students.
2. Conducted Fall Colors Family Day. Estimated crowd of nearly one thousand people. The Parks Department also worked with the Normal Community High School Drama Club to have them conduct the Haunted Trail portion of the program. Attendance for the Haunted trail was nearly double from last year.
3. Antlerless Archery Deer Management Update. To date seventeen deer have been harvested from COMLARA Park with two weeks remaining for that program. This is three more than last year's entire total. Firearm (Shotgun Only) Seasons will be November 21-23, December 4-7, and January 16-18.
