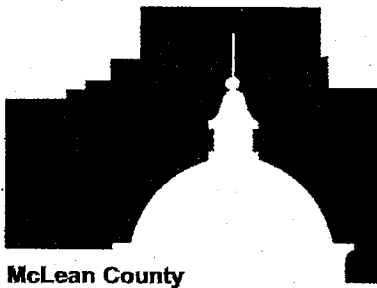

2. Historic Route 66 Trail IDOT Enhancement Grant Application

Governor Rod Blagojevich recently announced more than \$60 million in projects for the Illinois Transportation Enhancement Program (ITEP). Statewide, 107 projects have been chosen to receive funding. During this round the Illinois Department of Transportation reviewed 376 applications requesting more than \$349 million in federal funds. ITEP provides federal funds for alternative transportation and preserving visual and cultural resources.

The Historic Route 66 grant application by the McLean County Highway Department on behalf of the Historic Route 66 Trail intergovernmental partners, for construction engineering and construction of phases 1 and 2 submitted in 2005 was not funded in this grant round. IDOT has provided no information on when the Next ITEP grant round will take place.

The following represent the breakdown of costs for construction of Phase 1 & 2. Under the Historic Route 66 Trail Intergovernmental Agreement, McLean County would fund approximately 25% of the local share of this project. It is not anticipated that sufficient local funds are available at this time to complete Phase 1 without federal grant assistance.

3. Renovation of Campground Electrical Systems

Department Staff completed installation of phase 2 of electrical renovations at COMLARA County Park campgrounds during early spring of 2006. Due to efficiencies realized by completing all but final electrical connections in-house, the Department was able to complete all of phases 1 and 2 in 2005 and 2006. This completion leaves one section of the campground with 35 campsites with 1970's era electrical systems which do not meet current NEC code nor meet current user demand. The Department's capital plan had called for replacing the remaining sites electrical systems in beginning in the spring of 2007.

Due to the fact that Parks and Recreation Department capital construction funds budgeted for 2006 Route 66 Trail construction will not be used this fiscal year, the Department would like to request moving forward with renovation of the final electrical renovation phase and the replacement of the campground park playground in the fall of 2006, instead of spring 2007. This will allow the Department more flexibility in scheduling of work and sufficient time to complete landscaping and grounds rehabilitation prior to the 2007 camping season.. It will also allow us to simultaneously do ground excavation on these two projects. All permits required for installation of the electrical systems remain in effect. Sufficient funds are available to complete both projects. Completion of final Phase of electrical renovation is estimated at \$40,000 . The playground installation is budgeted at \$15,000.

4. Evergreen Lake Total Maximum Daily Load(TMDL Project)

Section 303(d) of the federal Clean Water Act (CWA) and the Water Quality Planning and Management regulation at 40 CFR Part 130 f requires states, in part, to:

- i) identify waters which will not attain applicable water quality standards with technology based controls alone (i.e., water quality limited).
- ii) identify waters for which controls on thermal discharges are not stringent enough to assure protection and propagation of a balanced indigenous population of shellfish, fish and wildlife sufficient to achieve water quality standards.
- iii) establish a priority ranking for such waters, taking into account the severity of pollution and the uses to be made of such waters.
- iv) target waters for development of Total Maximum Daily Loads (TMDLs) that would be initiated before the next reporting period.

Illinois EPA created its first 303(d) List in 1992, which was based on the 16 screening categories from the EPA 1992 listing guidance (U.S. EPA 1991). A similar methodology was used for the 1994 and 1996 lists. The 1998 listing criteria were based on the EPA 1998 listing guidance (U.S. EPA 1997a) and included waters impaired by both point and non-point sources. On previous lists, impaired waters were only listed if their sources were point sources such as wastewater treatment plants or industrial discharges. Impairment by non-point sources includes many impacts of urban run-off, agriculture and rural septic disposal.

Primarily for this reason, the 1998 list contained many more waters. Lake Bloomington was initially listed in 1994. Evergreen Lake and Dawson Lake were designated as impaired under the 303(d) list in 1998. Additions since that time include the Mackinaw River in 2002. Sugar Creek & Kickapoo Creek are additions included on 2006 draft documents.

The Illinois EPA Section 303(d) List was prioritized based on use designations, establishing a High, Medium and Low Priority for specific uses.

High Priority – watersheds containing one or more water bodies that are less than full support for public water supply use.

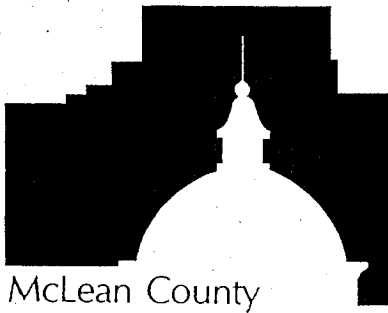
Medium Priority – watersheds containing one or more water bodies that are less than full support for aquatic life use, fishing use, or primary contact (swimming) use.

Low Priority – watersheds containing one or more water bodies that are less than full support for secondary contact (recreation) use.

Both Evergreen Lake(Six Mile Creek) and Lake Bloomington(Money Creek) watersheds support public water supply and were therefore given high priority in the development of Total daily Maximum Loads(TMDL). Both the Evergreen Lake and Lake Bloomington TMDL processes are currently underway. Once a TMDL process is initiated on a given watershed, additional point-source(regulated) load, such as an increase in wastewater treatment output within the watershed, will not be permitted. Future Phase II Urban Storm Water permits may also be affected by TMDL. Evergreen Impairments include suspended solids and phosphorus. Lake Bloomington impairments include suspended solids, phosphorus, and nitrates.

The McLean County Department of Parks and Recreation is actively working with staff from the County Planning & Zoning Dept., City of Bloomington Water Dept., Town of Normal Engineering, BNWRD, NRCS, Soil & Water Conservation District, IDNR, IEPA, agricultural landowners/operators within the watershed and concerned citizens to identify opportunities and associated funding sources to reduce impairment levels that have been designated as exceeding appropriate levels at the two the lakes by IEPA.

The IEPA anticipates doing approximately 20 TMDL projects per year for the next 10 years. It is likely that such TMDL projects will include many portions of, if not all watersheds of McLean County over this period. Implementation and planning of these various TMDL projects may therefore become an on-going watershed quality/storm water management process for the foreseeable future.

The Property Committee asked me to contact the area sign companies, including the sign companies that had previously submitted a proposal for replacing the Fairview Campus sign, for updated proposals.

We contacted the two remaining firms who had originally submitted a proposal and learned that one of the firms desired to reduce their price by \$1,000.00 and the other company was still firm on their price. Prairie Signs new price is \$11,200.00 and Sign-A-Rama remains firm at \$13,959.00.

We contacted Super Sign Company, Bloomington, IL who had received the original proposal. We asked them if they were interested in submitting a proposal and they said yes. On July 27, 2006, Super Sign Company submitted a proposal for \$6,500.00 based upon the original bid specifications. Super Sign Company is a union shop.

We therefore request and recommend the Property Committee kindly consider accepting the proposal from Super Sign Company to replace the Fairview campus sign.


