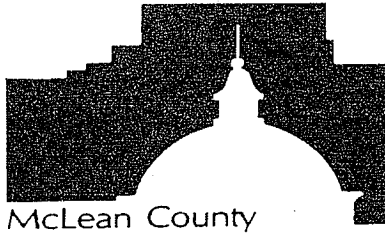

Re: Replacement of a boiler at the McLean County Nursing Home

Originally we decided to move the boiler replacement project to 2011 because of the expected need to add soffit sprinklers. The good news is we were able to show the Illinois Department of Public Health that we were not required to install soffit sprinklers per NFPA code, unfortunately the boiler heat exchanger has a leak and can't be repaired. In addition to the \$40,000 originally budgeted for soffit sprinklers we have delayed a \$55,000 fire panel replacement project to 2011. By eliminating these projects totaling \$95,000, we will more than cover the \$27,810 for the boiler replacement we are seeking approval for.

As some of you may know we have very limited space in our boiler room. The space limitations reduce the brands and types of boilers that can fit. We currently have three 2 million BTU boilers. Two of the boilers were purchased approximately 18 years ago. We did replace one boiler in 2006. All of our current boilers are Patterson Kelley models and have served us very well. The newer Patterson Kelley boilers have the same footprint as the older units we currently use. They are the only boiler of this size that fits into the space available which is what we found in 2006 during that replacement project. In 2006 we installed a 2 million BTU, non-condensing, modulating boiler. During that public bid process the Patterson Kelley dealer was the only bidder involved because of the space limitation specifications that we required and we still have those limitations. No other company offered a bid for this replacement project as they could not meet the specifications we required.

We sent out 4 requests for quotations for this project and received three proposals back:

- Sandberg Company quoted the Patterson Kelley N2000-MFD Modufire FD Forced Draft 2,000,000 BTU non-condensing Boiler for \$23,310.00, which matches the boiler installed in 2006.
- CB Kramer quoted the Cleaver Brooks Model CFC-700-1800-125HW Clearfire boiler which is 1.8 million BTU fully condensing boiler for \$34,938.00
- Heat Transfer Specialists has quoted a Thermal Solutions EVAM-2000 non-condensing boiler for \$21,018.00
- Fluid Air Products – quoted the Atlas A200N boiler for \$26,429.00
- All boilers require the same exhaust flue for \$4,500 from CB Kramer

We have found that Patterson Kelley boilers are relatively trouble-free with proper preventative maintenance. There are factory trained service technicians with CB Kramer located in Bloomington. We have also seen substantial gas usage reduction since the 2006 installation along with some heating systems operating changes that were made; our total gas usage will be reduced again with the installation of a second modulating boiler. The quote from CB Kramer for the Cleaver Brooks boiler is cost prohibitive and space prohibitive. The quote from Heat Transfer Specialist is cost effective and matches up very well operationally with our requirements. The only problem is it is 90" tall and we only have 68" available. The cost to relocate piping to allow this boiler to fit would cost much more than the \$2,200.00 saving in initial boiler costs. The bid from Fluid Air Product is too large to get into the mechanical room and fit in the space available.

Therefore it is the recommendation of Eric Kline, Maintenance Supervisor, to purchase a Patterson Kelley Non-condensing two million BTU, N2000-MFD Modufire forced draft boiler from Sandberg Company for \$23,310 and purchase the required boiler flue from CB Kramer for \$4,500 for a total of \$27,810. The installation will be provided by the Nursing Home staff and the start-up to be provided by factory trained CB Kramer technicians.

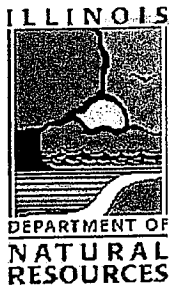

Gov. Quinn Announces \$15 Million in Public Museum Capital Grants

Projects will improve facilities, protect exhibits at public museums throughout Illinois

SPRINGFIELD - Governor Pat Quinn today awarded nearly \$15 million in grants to 51 public museums in Illinois for new and expanded facilities, exhibits and infrastructure improvements through the Illinois Public Museums Capital Grant Program.

"Illinois' public museums are some of our most valuable teaching resources. Students learn best when they have access to the hands-on learning available in museums throughout the state," said Governor Quinn. "These capital grants will help ensure that learning is not limited to classrooms – but that students will be able to continue visiting museums, zoos and gardens all over the state to put their lessons to practical use."

The Public Museum Capital Grants Program is designed to assist museums in expanding and upgrading facilities and creating new exhibits to enhance the ability of public museums to meet their missions.

A total of \$15 million in funding from the state's "Illinois Jobs Now!" capital program was made available for public museum capital grants for Fiscal Year (FY) 2010. Applications for this round of grants were accepted last spring. The maximum grant award for qualifying projects for FY2010 is \$800,000. The level of local matching funds required for each project is based on the level of attendance at the applicant museum during the preceding calendar year.

Since the program is funded by capital development bonds, only those museums operated by or located upon land owned by a unit of local government are eligible. The program is administered by the Illinois Department of Natural Resources.
