

Minutes of the Liquor Control Commission

The Liquor Control Commission of the McLean County Board met on Tuesday, June 19, 2018 at 9:54 a.m. in Room 404, Government Center, 115 E. Washington Street, Bloomington, Illinois.

Chairman McIntyre called the meeting to order 9:54 a.m.

Chairman McIntyre stated that the first item for action is approval of the June 20, 2017 Liquor Control Commission Meeting Minutes.

Motion by Metsker/Wendt to recommend approval of the June 20, 2017 Liquor Control Commission Meeting Minutes.
Motion carried.

Chairman McIntyre presented the Request for Approval of the Annual Liquor License Renewals for 2018-2019.

Ms. Walley stated that she had reviewed all of the applications that filed with the McLean County Clerk.

Ms. Walley indicated 12 application were received. She stated that the County Clerk's office followed up on missing items and questions that arose on a couple of the applications. Ms. Walley stated that 2018-2019 County Liquor Licenses applications were complete and in order for the following:

7. Larry Kelly, K M B & G Inc. dba Kelly's Merna Bar & Grill – Class A

8. Kyle Koerner, LeRoy Country Club – Class A and Outdoor Garden
9. Suketu Trividi Inc. dba Bloomington Fast Stop – Class A
10. Doug Chase, Indian Springs Recreation Association – Class A and Outdoor Garden
11. Rudolph & Mary Hofmann, White Oak Vineyards, Inc. d/b/a Sunset Lake Vineyards & Winery – Class B, and Outdoor Garden
12. David L. Turnis, American Legion Louis E. Davis Post 56, Inc. – Class B

Ms. Metsker asked if there had been any violations. Ms. Walley stated that none had been reported to the State's Attorney Civil Division office. There was a discussion about the process in which violations would be reported and routine visits by the Sheriff's department. Mr. McIntyre reminded the Committee that if there had been violations the Committee would have convened to determine appropriate action. Ms. Metsker asked if there is a question on the application regarding violations. Ms. Walley confirmed there was a question that asked for any violations, not just violations in the past year.


Mr. Soeldner asked about licenses for Epiphany Farms. Ms. Walley explained that the current licenses they hold would have been issued from Bloomington and LeRoy and not the County. There was a discussion about possible licensing in McLean County at the Vineyard and the process. Mr. McIntyre stated that Epiphany could file throughout the year and the Committee would convene to vote on the application. Mr. Soeldner asked if the rural specialty facility (a special use permit through the Zoning Board of Appeals) also encompassed liquor licensing. Ms. Walley advised that it was a separate permitting procedure, and that some facilities do not go through that procedure because caterers using their facility can obtain limited liquor licensing for special events.

Motion by Cavallini/Soeldner to recommend approval of the Annual Liquor License Renewals for 2018-2019.

Motion carried.

Chairman McIntyre asked if there was any further business to come before the Liquor Control Commission. Hearing none, he adjourned the Liquor Control Commission Meeting at 10:07 a.m.
