

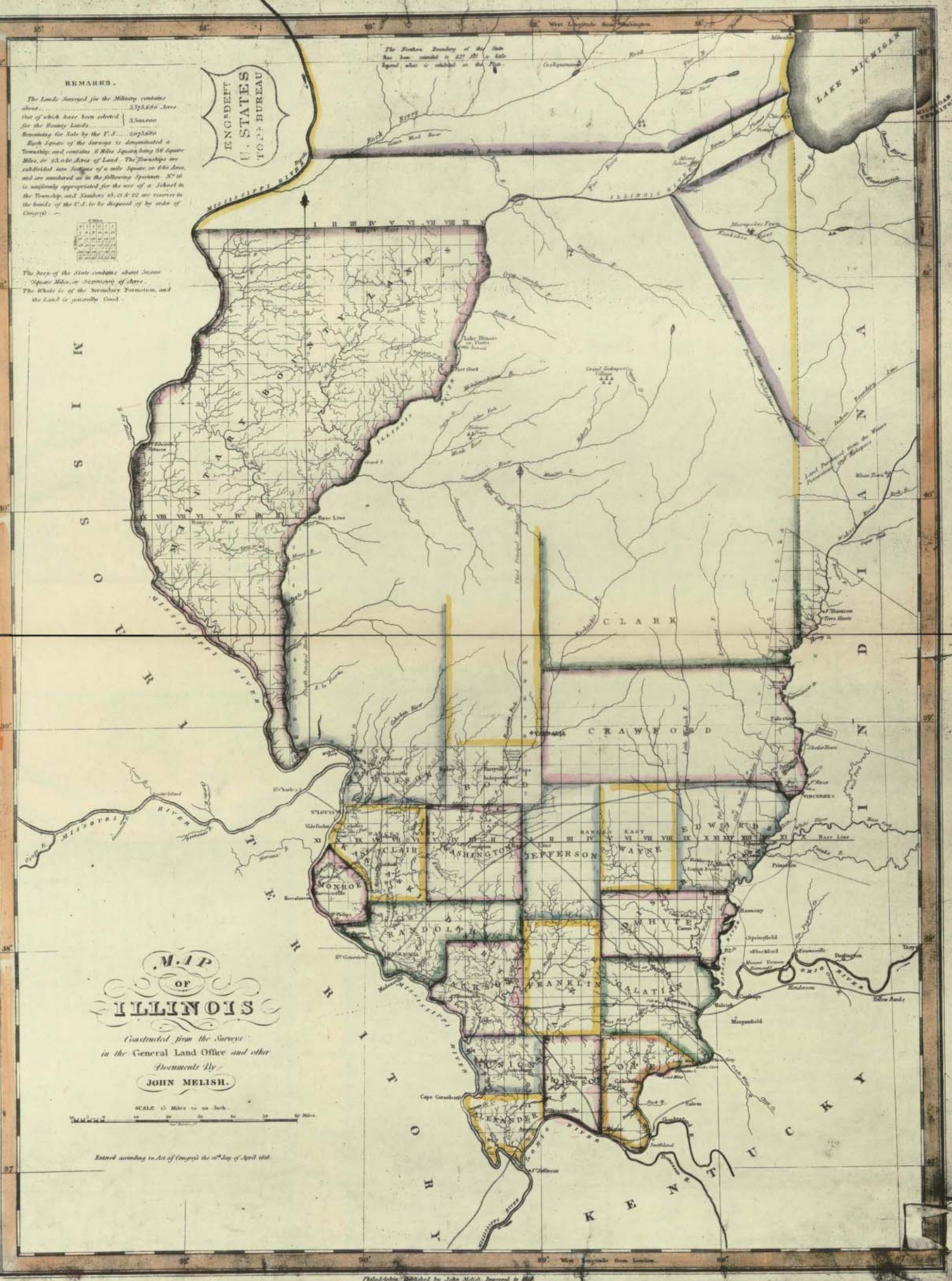
REMARKS.

The Lands Surveyed for the Military contain about 3,375,000 Acres, that of which have been selected 3,300,000 for the Heavy Lands, Remaining for Sale by the U.S. 75,000. Each Square of the Survey is designated a Township and contains 36 Miles Square, being 36 Square Miles, or 23,040 Acres of Land. The Townships are subdivided into Sections of a mile Square, or 640 Acres, and are numbered as in the following Specimen. No 16 is uniformly appropriated for the use of a School in the Township, and Numbers 35, 36 & 37 are reserved in the hands of the U.S. to be disposed of by order of Congress.
